Legislative Update

The new 2017-2018 legislative session has begun and already more than 300 bills have been introduced. Of course, that number will increase to more than 2,000 by the February 17 deadline to introduce new measures.

On the issue of life, two resolutions (and [HR 6](#) and [SR 12](#)) declare California's support for Roe v. Wade as the 44th anniversary of that fateful decisions approaches on January 22. In addition, [SR 9](#) opposes the defunding of Planned Parenthood and [HR 5](#) supports Planned Parenthood and its work. You may wish to contact your assembly member (HR 5 and 6) and senator (SR 9 and 12) and ask them to oppose these resolutions. Even though they have no force of law, it is important to share our concerns.

One bill is causing some concern on the part of homeschool families and others worried about its potential to negatively affect parental rights. [SB 18](#), authored by Dr. Richard Pan (D-Sacramento), seeks to codify a 2009 [resolution](#) declaring the Legislature's support for a Bill of Rights for the Children and Youth of California. Look for updates on this and other new legislation in coming months. A website has been established about the bill, which may be amended to add clarification and definition of terms and the measure proceeds. Find out more at [hnosb18.org](#).

Action: while the bill is still awaiting committee hearings, it is worthy of our action now by contacting our assembly member and state senator asking them to ensure that parental rights will not be harmed by this bill. Find your legislators [here](#).
